



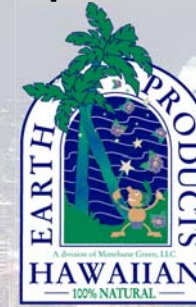
Norman Harris, Project Manager / Senior Landscape Designer
